Acts 9:32-43 - "Christ's Power Over Disease and Death"

Introduction:

3 big game changers in Acts:

- 1. Pentecost
- 2. Conversion of Saul
- 3. Conversion of Cornelius (Acts 10)

Acts 9:32-43 serve as a transition between Saul's conversion to the conversion of the gentile Cornelius.

Peter had to be convinced that the Gospel was for everyone.

3 big things to see through 9:32-11:18

- 1. Christ has power of disease (32-35)
- 2. Christ has power of death (36-42)
- 3. Christ has power over discrimination

Sermon Outline:

A. Christ has power of disease (32-35)

*here and there indicates a preaching tour to both evangelize and disciple

*believers are referred to as saints

*We are both declared and made holy

*Jesus alone has the power to heal

*make your bed

*many turned to the Lord

B. Christ power over death (36-42)

*Dorcas was a disciple of Jesus

*Peter cleared the room and praved

*Jesus alone has the power to raise from the dead

* "Tabitha. rise"

*Many believed in the Lord

v.43- Serves as a link to chapter 10.

*Peter stays at the house of a man who was ceremonial unclean by trade

4 signs of Authentic Apostleship of Peter:

1. Followed the example of Jesus

*Healing of paralytic in Mark 2:1-12 verse 11

*Raising of Jarius daughter in Mark 5:35-43. Verse 41

- -"Talitha, cumi" (Little girl, rise)
- "Tabitha, cumi" (Tabitha rise)
- *Peter was not doing things his own way... He was doing things the way the Lord has shown and told him
- *We do things the way God has instructed for us to do them

2. Performed in the power of Jesus

*v.34-Jesus heals you

*v.40- knelt down and prayed

*Peter knew there was no power within himself

3. Signs of the salvation of Jesus

*rise- same verb used for God raising Jesus

*Tabitha was resuscitated and would eventually die again

*both miracles portray the believer raising to new life

4. Resulted to the glory of Jesus

v.35- many turned to the Lord

v.42- many believed in the Lord

If who we follow or listen to do not check these 4 off then we shouldn't follow them...

"For the Christian, disease nor death have the final word..."

- -Jesus answer to the prayer for healing or resurrection is always yes
- -sometime on this side... but always on the other side
- -His words declaring the we are his have more authority
- -cancer, cirrhosis, anxiety, PTSD, heart failure, even death.... Have the last word
- -Romans 8:31-39
