Acts 16:25-40 — The Jailhouse Rocked

Sermon Outline

1. The Response to Persecution (16:25–26)

- a. Paul and Silas responded in prayer and praise.
 - *They were there because of obedience.
- b. The prisoners responded with attention and listening.
- c. The Lord responded with an earthquake.

2. The Jailer's Conversion (16:27–34)

- a. He awoke in fear, guilt, and judgement.
- b. He heard and believed the gospel of Christ's grace.
- c. He showed repentance and a changed heart.
 - *He washed Paul and Silas' wounds.
 - *He was baptized.
 - *He showed hospitality.
 - *He experienced the joy of salvation.

3. The Wisdom in Planting the Philippian Church (16:35–40)

- a. Paul's wisdom on knowing when to voice his rights
- b. Paul's wisdom in gaining protection for the new church
- c. Paul's wisdom in (probably) leaving Luke behind for the new believers
 - *"We" in 16:16, not picked up again until 20:5-6, Luke at Philippi

Application:

- 1. Our response to circumstances reveals our view of God. Our situations should drive us to prayer and praise.
- 2. We should be aware of how God providentially uses situations to put us in places to share the gospel.
- 3. We must show wisdom in our actions for the reputations of the gospel and the church in our city.

Small Group Discussion

- 1. How did the Holy Spirit speak to you through the sermon and Bible passage? What stood out to you?
- Discuss the different responses in the passage (Paul/Silas, the prisoners, the Lord).
 How was the Lord's response a picture of what had already occurred in the chapter?
 (For example: open doors and broken chains)
- 3. What was the jailer about to do to himself and why? Discuss how we as believers can help those in depression and despair.
- 4. What was the importance Paul and Silas further explaining the gospel in 16:32 after answering the jailer's question in 16:31? How should Acts 16:32 affect our evangelism? In what ways did the jailer show his repentance and faith?
- 5. Discuss the different ways Paul showed wisdom in 16:35–40. Why did he exercise his rights as a Roman citizen? If time permits, discuss the reasons why God directed the missionary team as he did in Acts 16.
