1 Peter 4:7-11 - Good Stewards of God's Grace

Two phrases set up the lens of the text:

- 1. "The end of all things is at hand"
- 2. "as good stewards of God's varied grace"

This passage does two things:

- 1. How we should respond in the realization of "the end of all things"?
- 2. How we can be good stewards of God's varied grace?

Or it could be said like this:

"The understanding that God is bringing history to an end should motivate believers to be good stewards of God's grace"

These two work together and teach us:

1. We are to depend on God. (4:7)

- With the knowledge of the end of all things, believers respond sensibly.
- We should be self-controlled and sober-minded.
- This realization should lead us to pray for God to move in whatever time is left.
- This realization should lead us to depend on God, which manifests in prayer.
- This realization should lead us to spend our time in prayer, loving one another, and serving one another.
- What about the outsider?
 - A church that loves one another naturally loves others outside.
- I also believe we see that this realization should provoke us to be good stewards of the grace we've been given and the time we've been given.
- Which leads to verses 8–11, where Peter tells us that we are stewards of God's grace by loving and serving one another.

2. We are to love one another. (4:8–9)

- "Above all"
 - John 13:34-35; John 15:12; 1 John 4:7-8, 11, 21; Romans 12:10
- "Keep loving one another earnestly"
 - Earnestly = stretched
 - Loving isn't necessarily easy, but it is necessary.
 - We've missed this somewhere along the way.
 - We tend to shoot our own injured.
- "Love covers a multitude of sins"
 - Not in atoning for sin
 - But dealing with and accepting people even when they sin
 - We become agents of God's grace to a brother who has fallen in sin.

3. We are to serve one another (4:10–11)

- Our gifting comes from God.
- Our gifting is for serving.
- We must be good stewards of God's grace.
 - Spiritual gifts fundamentally are not a privilege but a responsibility. It's a call to be faithful with what has been given.
- "Varied grace" = of many colors
 - 1:6 "grieved by various trials" (all shapes, shades, and sizes)
 - 4:10 "varied grace" (all shapes, shades, and sizes)
 - There is no trial that we face that God's grace cannot fit.
 - God uses his people to be instruments of grace to one another by loving and serving.
 - That's the gift of God's people to God's people.
- All for his purpose and glory
 - Speaking and serving

Application

We exist for God's glory by committing ourselves to God's Truth, <u>God's People</u>, and God's Mission.

Committing to a church in 2024 is counter-cultural.

Who (not what) do we commit to?

- The church is all people from all time who have been saved by God's grace.
- We commit to a local body of born-again believers.
- We commit ourselves to a people.

Why do we commit?

- For instruction of God's Word
- To serve and edify one another through the proper use of spiritual gifts
- To participate in the ordinances of the Lord's Supper and Baptism
- For the Great Commission
- It gives us a context to obey the "one another" commands in the NT.

How do we commit?

- We are a people in place. (Sunday morning gathering)
- We are a people in places. (Weekly small groups)
