# CP - 4/21/24 Acts 21:37–22:16 - Paul's Defense in Jerusalem

# Sermon Outline

- The crowd beat Paul; they shouted "away with him" and were trying to kill him.
- The tribune came into the temple with at least 200 soldiers into the temple court and seized Paul. (21:32)
- Paul is taken back toward the Antonia Fortress when he asks the tribune for permission to address the crowd from the steps.
- This speech is the first of Paul's five defenses in Acts:
  - 22:1–21 (before the crowd at the Antonia Fortress)
  - 23:1–10 (before the Sanhedrin and Roman tribune)
  - 24:10-21 (before Felix in Caesarea)
  - 25:7–12 (before Festus in Caesarea)
  - 26:1–29 (before Festus, Agrippa, and Bernice in Caesarea)

# 1. Paul was always eager and ready to share Christ. (21:37-22:2)

- Paul believed in God's providence. (9:15; 20:23-24)
  - This moment is the opportunity he has waited for/possibly dreaming about for years to share the gospel with his people in Jerusalem! (Rom 9:1–3; 10:1–4)
  - Tommy Middleton: We are more concerned about the injustices of the moment
  - than the opportunities to share the gospel. Paul put the gospel first!
- Paul knew his audience and seized the opportunity. (Greek, Aramaic)

# 2. Paul's Life Before Christ (22:3–5)

- Religious Heritage and Learning
- Religious Zeal and Action
- Religious but Lost

# 3. Paul's Conversion to Christ (22:6-16)

- Revelation of Christ (6–9) personal, pointed, powerful
- Conviction of Sin (7-9) personal, pointed, powerful
- Submission, Repentance, and Faith (10-16) "What shall I do, Lord?" He obeyed Christ!

# - Baptism in itself does not bring forgiveness

- Acts 8:13, 20–23 Simon was baptized but still lost.
- Acts 10:44-48 Cornelius and family receive the Holy Spirit and are baptized later.
- 1 Corinthians 1:17 Baptism is separated/distinguished from the gospel.
- 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 Baptism not listed with the description of the gospel.

### **Application:**

- What is your testimony? Do you have a testimony of salvation?
- Who are you sent to share your testimony?
- Do you believe God orders your circumstances for you to share?

### Small Group Discussion

- 1. How did the Holy Spirit speak to you through the Bible passage and sermon Sunday? What stood out to you? What questions do you have?
- 2. Discuss the background of Paul's speech. Where was he speaking, and what is the significance? How were these circumstances a result of God's providence and Paul's prayer? (See Acts 9:15; 20:23–24; Romans 9:1–3; 10:1–4)
- 3. How did Paul's actions and words show his knowledge of his audience? Does our audience change the way we share the gospel? If so, in what appropriate ways? Discuss as a group.
- 4. Discuss who Paul was before he knew Christ. Why is it so dangerous to be religious without truly being saved? Why is it so easy in our culture? Discuss as a group.
- 5. Discuss Paul's conversion experience. What were the different parts of his conversion? (See Main Point 3 above.) How do these parts correspond to every Christian's testimony? Discuss both the mystery of conversion and yet certainty of it. Ask a few people in your group to share their conversion testimony.
