Sermon Outline:

Key Verse: Matthew 14:33—"and those in the boat worshipped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God"

- They had been out there for a long time (25)

- Their fear clouded their view (26)

- His Knowledge (24-25)
- His Protection (26-27)
- His Love and Gentleness (28-31)
- His Power (32)

3. The Statement of faith and worship

- Storms serve as an instrument for the Lord to reveal who He is.
- Storms serve as an instrument to grow our faith in the Son of God.
- Storms serve as an instrument to increase our worship of the Son of God.

Application:

- We learn what absolute power our Savior has over all created things.
- We learn what power Jesus can bestow on them that believe in Him
- We learn how much trouble we brings on ourselves by unbelief
- We learn how merciful Jesus is to weak believers
