# Sermon Outline:

Matthew 16:28— " Truly I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom"

## Setting

- after six days
  - Luke says 8— doesn't count the day of the promise to the day of transfiguration
  - Exodus 24— Moses receiving the law after 6 days of preparation
  - A cloud covered the mountain
- Peter High and low
- High mountain
- 1. A Glimpse of the Glory of Jesus
- He is God
  - Transfigured = unveiled
    - Philippians 2:6— "who though he was in the form of God, did count equality with God a things to be grasped but emptied himself"
    - Psalm 104:2— "you are clothed with splendor and majesty, covering yourself with light as with a garment, stretching out the heavens like a tent"
    - Matthew 16:27— "coming in the glory of His father"
    - Hebrews 1:3— "He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of His nature"
- He is the fulfillment of the Law and Prophets
  - 2 Witnesses Deut. 19:15 2 or 3 witnesses
    - Better Moses
      - Exodus 13:29-34
      - Moses had a reflective glory
      - Jesus had a glory of his own
      - Luke 9- his exodus to accomplish
      - Not His departure, but His exodus he would accomplish of redeeming men/women from the world
    - Better Elijah
      - Fulfillment of law and prophets
      - Sermon on mount Matthew 5:17
      - Matthew 11:13
- He will return in glory

- His death is not the end

## 2. The Affirmation of the Father

- cloud overshadowed
- same as baptism
- Listen to him
- Deut 18:15— "The Lord you God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brothers— it is to him you shall listen"
- Encouraged the son (for the joy set before)
- Comforted and commanded the disciples

## 3. The response of the disciples

- Make tents (Peter) didn't want to leave this place
- Appropriate response to God's presence
  - Fear
  - Fell on their faces
- Jesus invites us into the presence of God
  - Rise and have no fear
- Saw only Jesus... He's greater
  - He has spoken through his son

### **Application:**

- \*\* His glory is our hope
  - the transfiguration served as a counterbalance to His previous teachings
- \*\* We ought to believe in Him
- \*\* We ought to obey Him
- \*\*We ought to live with an expectation of His second coming
- \*\* He is in complete control

- 6. How does the transfiguration serve as a foretaste of Christ's second coming? And how should this affect our daily lives?
- 7. How does this passage inspire us to walk in hope today? How can we live out greater belief and hope in Him in light of this text?
