Psalms of Theology – Covenant (Part 1)

Psalm 105 is also 1 Chronicles 16 when the ark is brought back to Jerusalem

Paul last week – CURSE

- sin affects everyone and everything
- “God created what is good, Satan confused who/what is good, and man chooses what he thinks is good” (pattern of the bible)
- Genesis 3— the Fall (3:15 from the seed of woman, one will come)
- Seed represents offspring (genealogies will lead the way)
- Sin spreads immediately
- Adam and Eve’s son, Cain murders his brother Abel (Genesis 4)
- Adam to Noah (Genesis 5)
- Sin spreads not just in action but intention (Genesis 6:5)
- Tower of Babel (Genesis 11)
- **Galatians 3:13— “Christ redeems us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us”**

The question becomes, “What does God do with the continual rebellion of man?”

He covenants Himself to them..

1. Theology should result in doxology (1-4)

2. The Covenant God (5-15)

- He covenants to sinners (6)

- Where did Abraham come from?
- Genesis 6 gives us the lineage from Adam to Noah
- Genesis 9 tells us Noah’s sons (Shem, Hem, Japeth)
- Genesis 11 (Shem, Arpachshad, Shelah, Eber, Peleg, Reu, Serug, Nahor, Terah, Abram)
- **Joshua 24:2— “Thus says the Lord God, the God of Israel, long ago, your fathers lived beyond the Euphrates, Terah the father of Abraham and of Nahor, and they served other gods”**
- Genesis 12 says that “The Lord said to Abram”
- “I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing”
 - Always for the nations
- God is a God who calls sinners to know Him and be blessed by Him to be a blessing to others
- Isn’t that good news this morning?

- He remembers His covenant (8)

- Genesis 9 — Noah
- Genesis 12, 15 (a son), 17:5 (new name)
- “Be fruitful and multiply (garden, 9:18, 35:11)
- Why is this important for us?
- From Noah to Abraham to Jacob, we can trace the sinfulness of man.
- But each time, God remembers His covenant
- Why was God so patient with these men? Israel? Us?
- He’s a God who remembers His covenant
- Why does he remain faithful and steadfast?
- Genesis 17:6— fruitful, nations, and kings
- He is faithful to His promise....
- God remembers His covenant, so we should remember Him

- **He protects His covenant people (12-15)**

- Genesis 21- Issac is born
- Geneis 22- God calls Abraham to sacrifice Issac then provides a ram as a substitute
- Genesis 24/25— Jacob is born
- Jacob will have a son named Joseph (and that's where we will pick up next week)
